Definitions for Open Data – Student Learning Survey

(Last Updated: October 2023)

Definition
This extract contains data on the Student Learning Survey (SLS) questions and responses from 2016/2017 to 2022/2023 for public school students .
The Student Learning Survey is an annual province-wide census of Grades 4, 7, 10 and 12 students, their parents, and staff in public schools regarding their school experience.
As of school year 2016/2017, the student portion of the previous Satisfaction Survey was renamed as the Student Learning Survey. Data and definitions of the Satisfaction Survey are available in another <u>dataset on DataBC</u> .
In 2021/2022, SLS underwent a review to update the conceptual framework of the survey such that questions were aligned to measure the <u>Core Competencies</u> stemming from BC's Redesigned Curriculum and the Ministry's <u>Policy for Student Success</u> . The update also introduced questions centered on evaluating the <u>Ministry's Mandate</u> <u>Commitments</u> following the pandemic.
Therefore, data from 2021/2022 onward will be different when compared to earlier years as questions have been modified, new questions replaced old ones, and response options have changed. Due to these changes, we advise users to exercise caution when comparing the responses from 2021/2022 onward to earlier years.
'Msk' (masked) values are for numbers fewer than 10, to prevent the identification of individuals.

SURVEY_QUESTION	The full survey question/statement.
QUESTION_ID	This is an alpha-numeric (e.g., 'Q42', 'NQ3' or 'S27') code that enables the consistent identification of equivalent questions across survey sessions and respondent groups.
	For example, 'Q42' is assigned to the following questions:
	Are you satisfied that school is preparing you for a job in the future? (<i>asked of students</i>)
	Are you satisfied that school is preparing your child for a job in the future? (asked of parents)
GRADE	The grade level of the survey.
	Values: '3' '4' '7' '10' '12'
	Beginning in 2021/22, Grade 3 students in K-3 schools are no longer required to participate in the grade 4 survey. Therefore, from 2021/2022 onward values will only reflect '4', '7', '10', '12'.
POSITIVE_CNT	Count of survey responses grouped into the Positive category. Response options and combinations used for the grouping vary by question.
