SCHOOL_YEAR	The school year that commences on July 1 and ends the following June 30,

REPORTING_PERIOD	The quarter of the school year (3-month period) for which the data were reported.
	Note: The quarters aren't separate, they are cumulative from July 1 (legal start of school year).
DISTRICT_NUMBER	The number of the school district. This does not include independent school authorities.

EMPLOYMENT_CATEGORY	This column can be filtered to select results for all Educators, or two different sub-groupings of Educator.
	Values:
	'Administrator' A person who has a valid British Columbia teaching certificate and is employed by a school board or authority to provide administrative duty in schools. Includes Principals, Vice-Principals, and Directors of Instruction.
	'Educator' A teacher or administrator having BC teacher certification, and is employed by a public school board in British Columbia. The term excludes a person appointed by a board as superintendent of schools or assistant superintendent of schools.
	'Teacher' An individual who has a valid BC teaching certificate and is employed by a school board to provide an educational program to students or to administer or supervise the provision of an educational program to students. Includes: Regular Classroom Teachers, Supervisors of Instruction, Teacher Consultants, Co-ordinators, Helping Teachers, Other Instructional Support, Testing & Assessment – Professional Staff, Department Heads, and Teachers who have administration duty but are not Department Heads.
GENDER	The self-identified gender of the Educator.
	Values: 'All' 'F' (= Female) 'M' (= Male)
HEADCOUNT	The number of individual Educators.
FTE	The total full-time equivalent Educator positions.
AVERAGE_AGE	The average age of the Educators.

AVERAGE_ANNUAL_SALARY_PER_FTE	The average annual salary per full-time equivalent Educator. (Total salaries divided by total FTE, based on the EMPLOYMENT_CATEGORY selected.)
	The total salary is the sum of the basic annual salary and all allowances paid to each educator, reported to the nearest dollar
	Each individual's total salary is made up of four parts:
	• To the nearest dollar, the basic annual salary received by each educator as of September 30 of the school year. For all Teachers, this will be the salary according to the salary grid under the collective agreement Note: Any teachers not paid by the grid should have grid salary recognized by their base salary, and the difference in other allowances.
	• To the nearest dollar, the annual amount of any administrative allowance paid to each Educator. This includes allowances for principals, vice-principals, administrative assistants, department heads, etc.
	• For those districts which have isolation allowances in their collective agreement, the annual amount (to the nearest dollar) of any such allowances paid to each educator.
	• To the nearest dollar, the annual amount of any other allowances paid to Educators which are not defined as administrative or isolation allowance.
