

Definitions for Open Data – Class Size

Column	Definition
[Definition of extract]	<p>This extract includes average class size for select grade groupings, the number of reported classes with assigned Education Assistants, and the number of reported classes with more than 30 students. This information is available at school-, district-, and province-level for standard BC public schools.</p> <p>The data in this table begins with school year 2006/2007.</p>
[Technical Notes]	<p>Class Organization information is collected annually by the Ministry of Education from public schools to monitor school district compliance with class size legislation (the Class Size Regulation within the School Act). The counts reflect the class organization as of the time specified in that year’s instructions (typically between Sept 30 and October 15th).</p>

SCHOOL_YEAR	<p>The school year that commences on July 1 and ends the following June 30, based on the session of the assessment.</p> <p>For this data set, the earliest school year is '2006/2007'.</p>
DATA_LEVEL	<p>Use this column to select results at the province-, district-, or school-level.</p> <p>Values: 'Province Level', 'District Level', 'School Level'</p>
PUBLIC_OR_INDEPENDENT	<p>This extract contains information on public standard schools only.</p> <p>The only value is 'BC Public School'.</p>
DISTRICT_NUMBER	<p>The number of the school district.</p> <p>This value is a 3-digit string (e.g. 005, 023). However, leading zeros may be automatically removed when opening the file in Excel. See <i>Working with the Class Size extract</i> guide for tips on how to prevent this from happening.</p> <p>For the actual name of the district, please see the column DISTRICT_NAME.</p>
DISTRICT_NAME	<p>The name of the school district.</p> <p>For the number of the district, please see the column DISTRICT_NUMBER.</p>

Column	Definition
SCHOOL_NUMBER	<p>The eight-digit numerical identifier assigned to the school by the Ministry of Education. The school identifier is also known as the Mincode ("Ministry Code"). The first three digits are often the district number (geographic district number).</p> <p>See <i>Working with the Class Size extract</i> guide for tips on how to prevent this from happening.</p> <p>For the actual name of the school, please see the column SCHOOL_NAME.</p>
SCHOOL_NAME	<p>The name of the school.</p> <p>For the number of the school, please see the column SCHOOL_NUMBER.</p>
NUMBER_SCHOOLS	<p>The number of schools in a data level (i.e., at the school, district, or province level), from which the values in columns I through O are derived.</p>
TOTAL_CLASSES	<p>The total number of classes at a data level, from which the values in columns J through O are derived.</p>
TOTAL_WITH_EA	<p>The number of reported classes with an Education Assistant.</p>
TOTAL_CLASSES_GREATER_30	<p>The number of reported classes with more than 30 students.</p>
AVG_CLASS_SIZE_ALL_GRADES	<p>The average class size across all grades.</p>
AVG_CLASS_SIZE_K	<p>The average kindergarten class size.</p>
AVG_CLASS_SIZE_1_TO_3	<p>The average class size for grades 1 to 3.</p>
AVG_CLASS_SIZE_4_TO_7	<p>The average class size for grades 4 to 7.</p>
AVG_CLASS_SIZE_8_TO_12	<p>The average class size for grades 8 to 12.</p>
